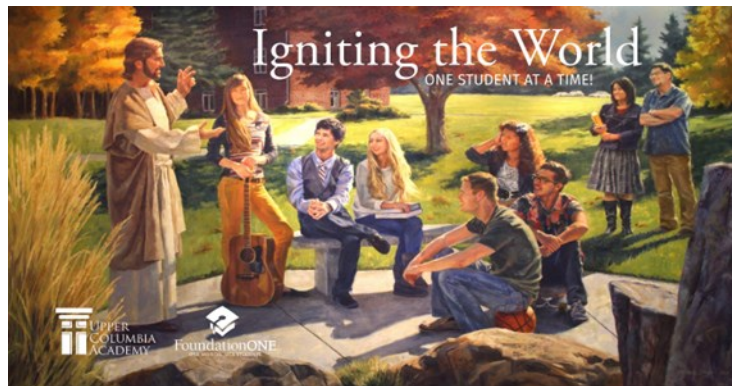


Upper Columbia Academy Faculty Home Project, 2023

Accommodations

There is space for 50 volunteers on this project. Volunteers who request housing may stay in the dormitory or at one of the 30 RV sites. If staying in the dormitory, you will need to bring your own bedding, towels, etc. If using an RV site, please note that there are no water or sewage hookups, and only a few sites have electricity (electricity is limited for those who have medical needs, i.e. CPAP machines).

Meals

UCA will provide three vegetarian meals each day, beginning with Sunday dinner at 5:00 p.m. and ending with Friday's lunch at 12:00 p.m. If you have dietary restrictions, please note the restriction on your application form.

Expenses

Attractions
